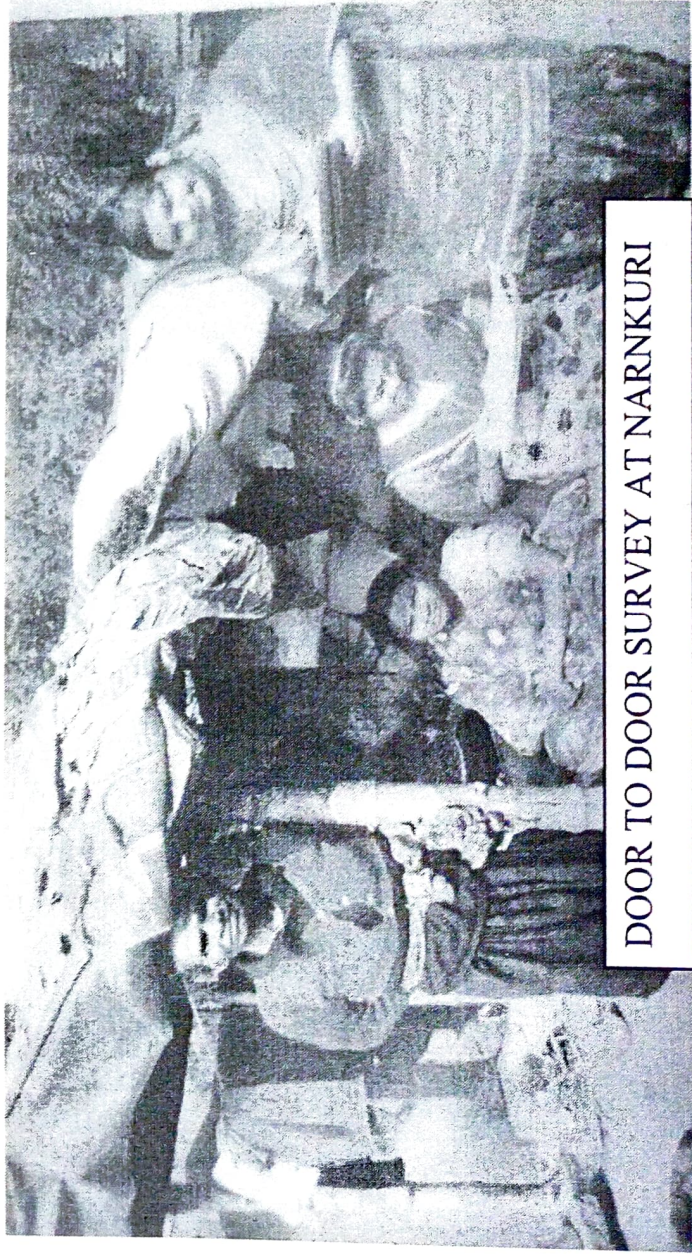

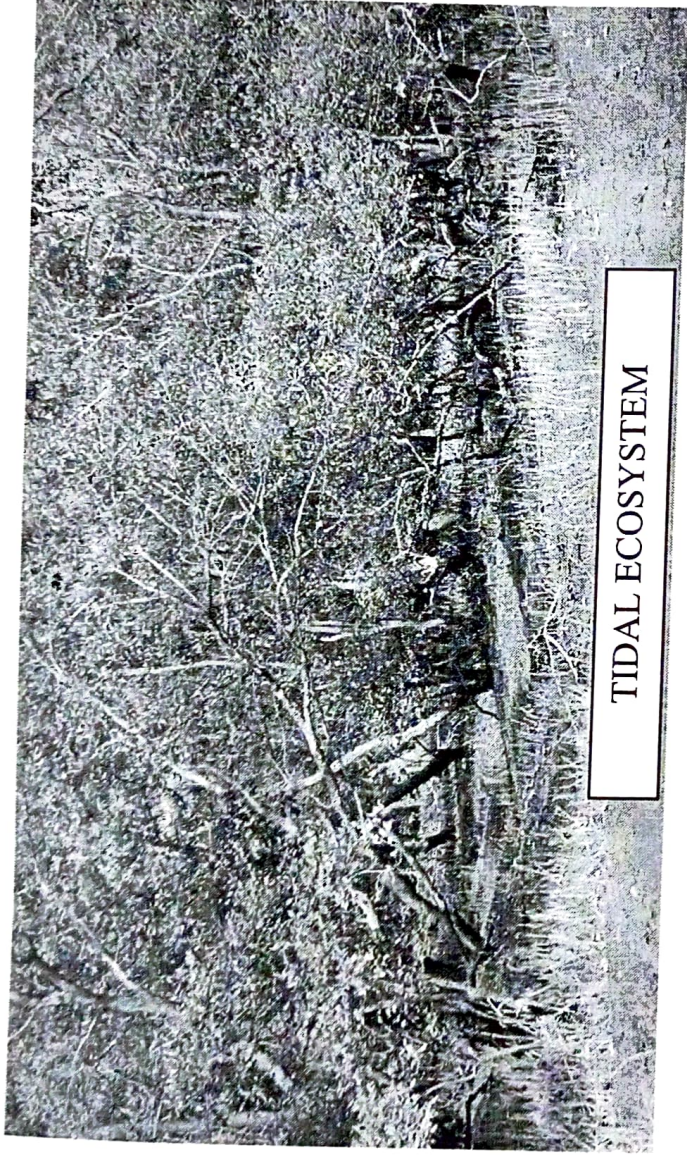

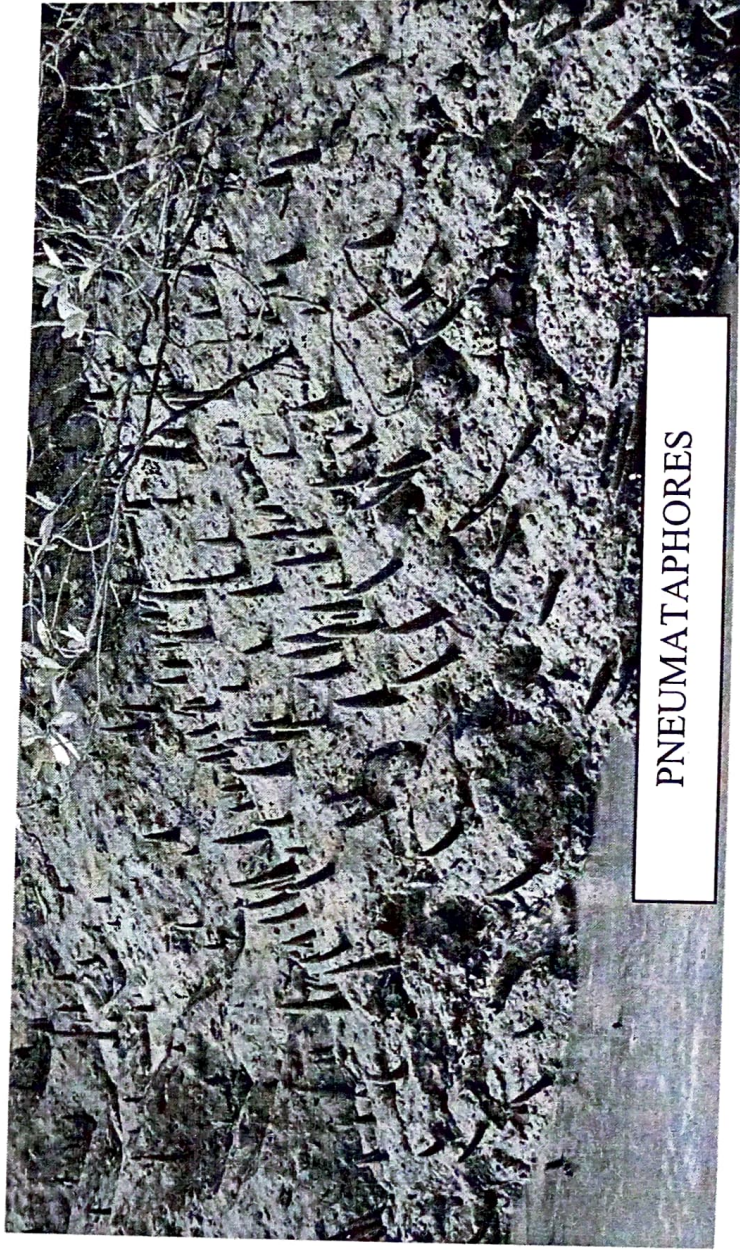
Place - Sunderbans

The Sunderbans is of universal importance for globally endangered species including the Royal Bengal Tiger, Ganges and Brahmaputra dolphins, estuarine crocodiles. It is the only mangrove habitat in the world for *Panthera tigris tigris*, tiger species. The purpose to befall Sunderbans is *Sonneratia caseolaris*, *Bruguiera gymnorhiza*, *Stilt roots*, *Pneumatophore*, *Nypa*, *Perforated Shark*. We came to know about the religious background from the people. Hindu and Muslim fishermen and honey collectors who worship *Bonbibi* (Forest lady). Sunderban is the biggest mangrove forest in the world. As we came to know from the resident of that place, that it occupies the coastal region of Khulna and partly of Barisal. This flat marshy plain is intersected by a network of river channels. Underground tissue of any plant requires oxygen for respiration and in mangrove environment oxygen is very limited or nil. This necessitates mangrove root system to take up oxygen from the atmosphere. Mangrove species have specialised above ground roots or pneumatophores. Area: 1330.10 sq. km. Minimum number of Tiger Reserve is 79. Coastal landforms - beach dune, swamps. We came to know about agriculture, fishery activity - 172 species of fishes, bees collect honey from the flowers of *Khalsa Tree*. Therefore, our purpose of covering the topics in geography by visiting Sunderban was fortunate.

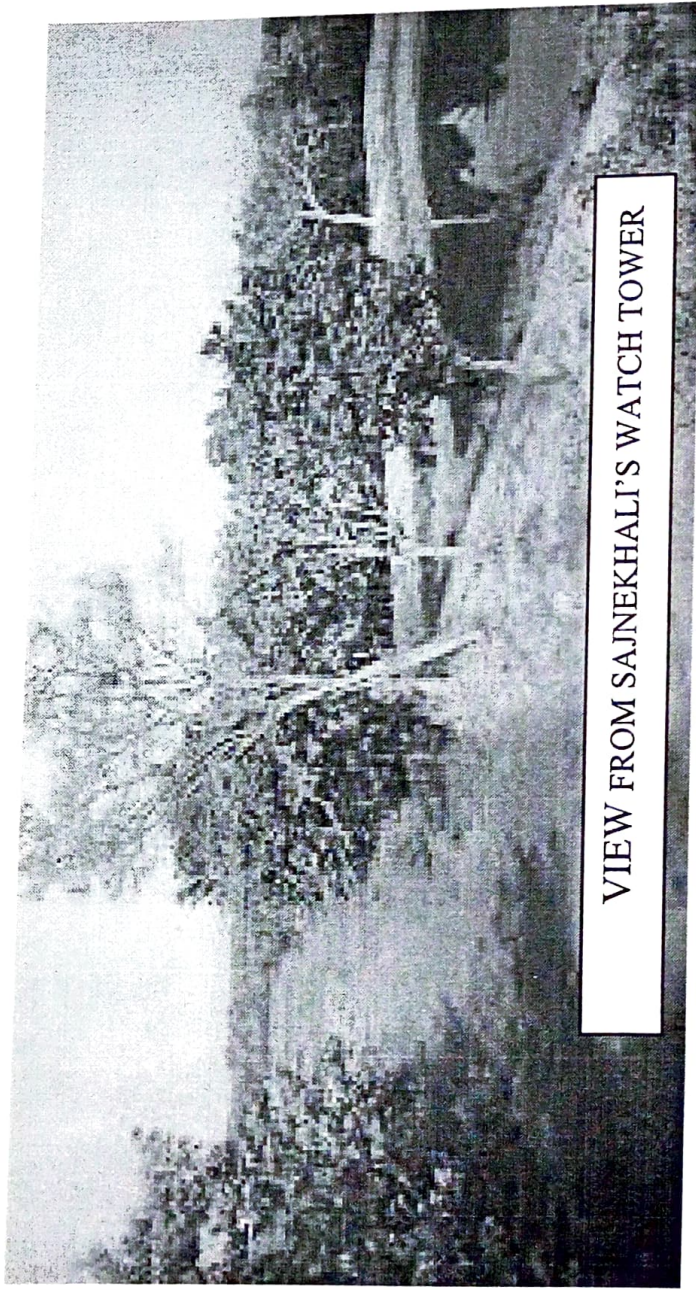
TIDAL ECOSYSTEM

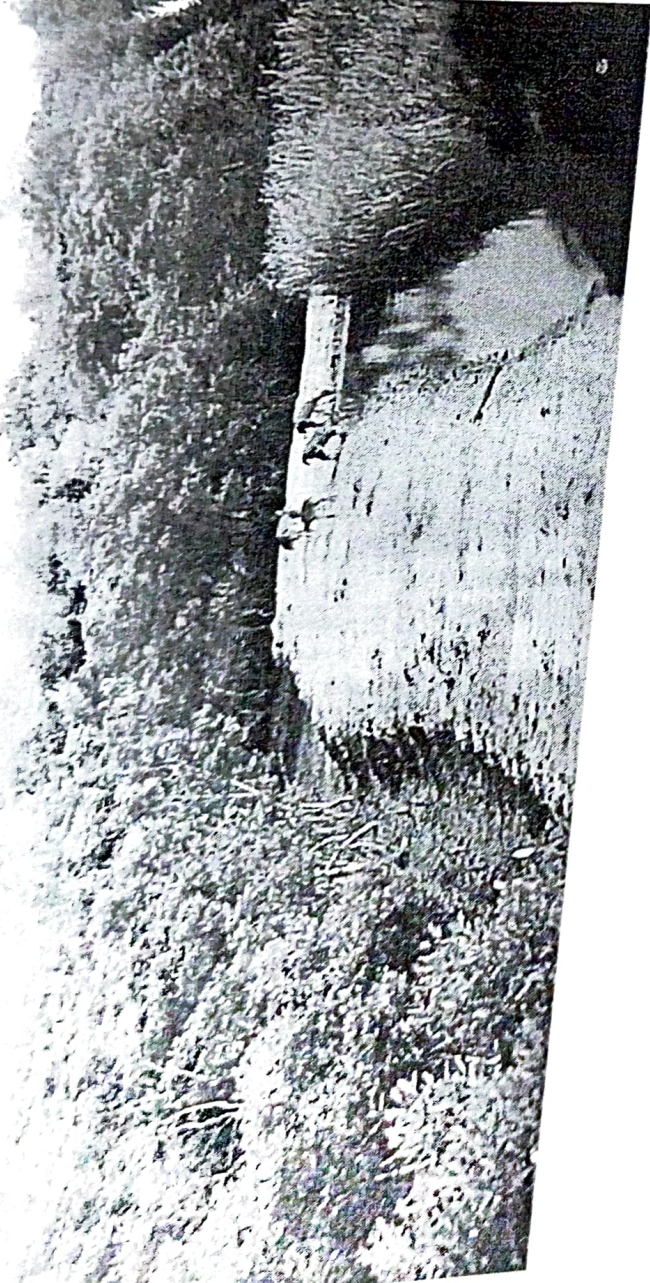

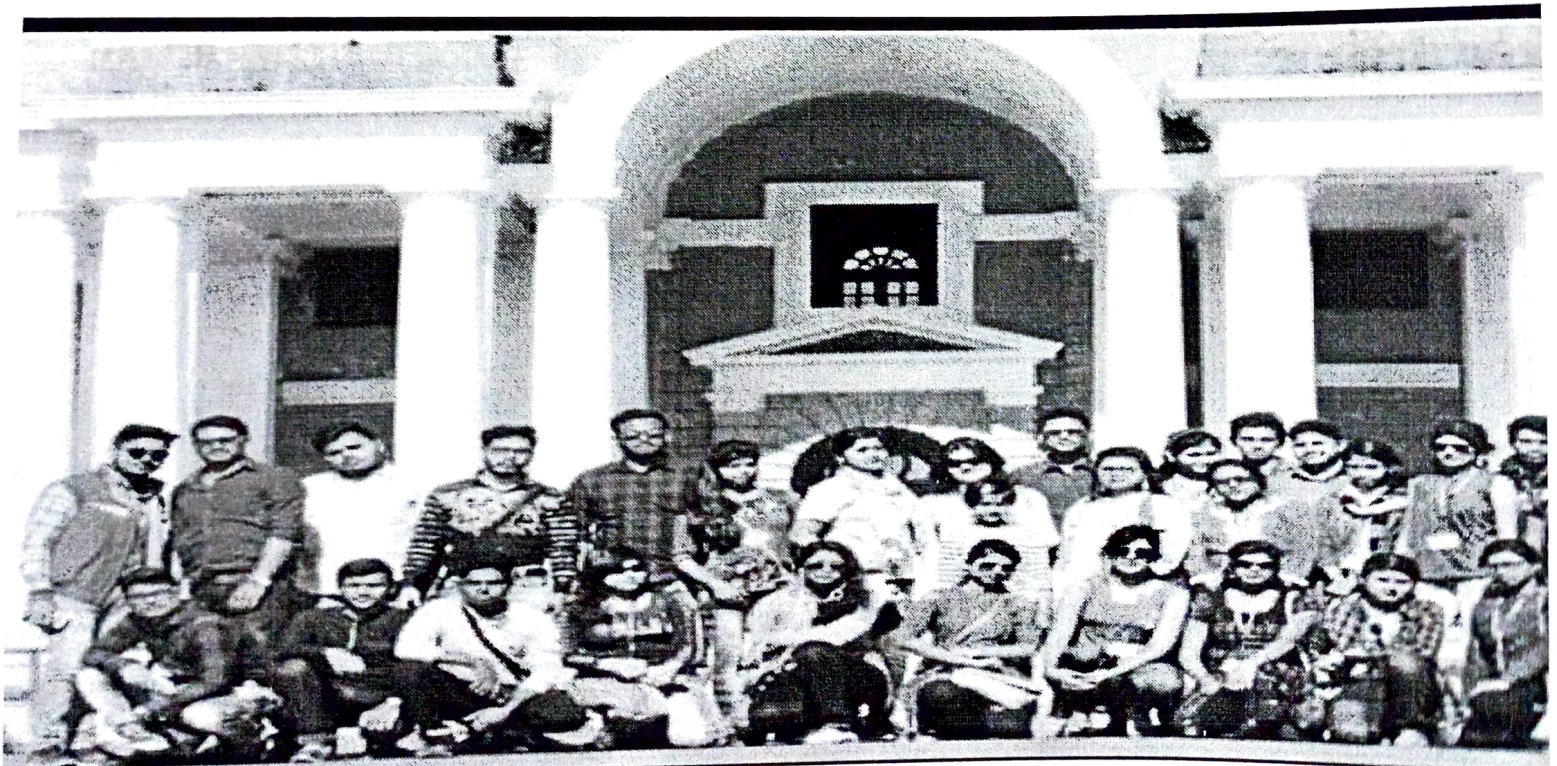
The Ganga River also known as the Ganges emerges from Deoprayag and exists at Haridwar, in Uttarakhand. Ganga flows through the Himalayan Valley, originates from the mountainous terrains of Rishikesh and debouches onto the Gangetic Plain at the holy city of Haridwar. The purpose of visiting Haridwar and its related places was to get introduced to Uttarakhand which has a highly varied topography, with snow-covered peaks, glaciers, deep canyons, roaring streams, beautiful lakes and a few patches of dusty plains in the south.

Dehradun is located in the Doon Valley on the foothills of Himalayas. Rishikesh is a city in India's northern state of Uttarakhand, in the Himalayan foothills, known as the 'Queen of the Hills.' Rishikesh is famous for its spiritual importance. Example - Nempty Fall. Mineral resources contain rocks - quartzite, marble, and various types of schist and gneiss, limestone, slate, phyllites. Bedding plane - we came to know is a surface that separates each successive layer of a stratified rock from its preceding layer. From the people living there we came to know about step farming which consists of different steps. It is built on slopes of hills and mountains. Tropical deciduous forest of Sal, Teak, Pine, Oak, Malnut, Larch, Shisham.

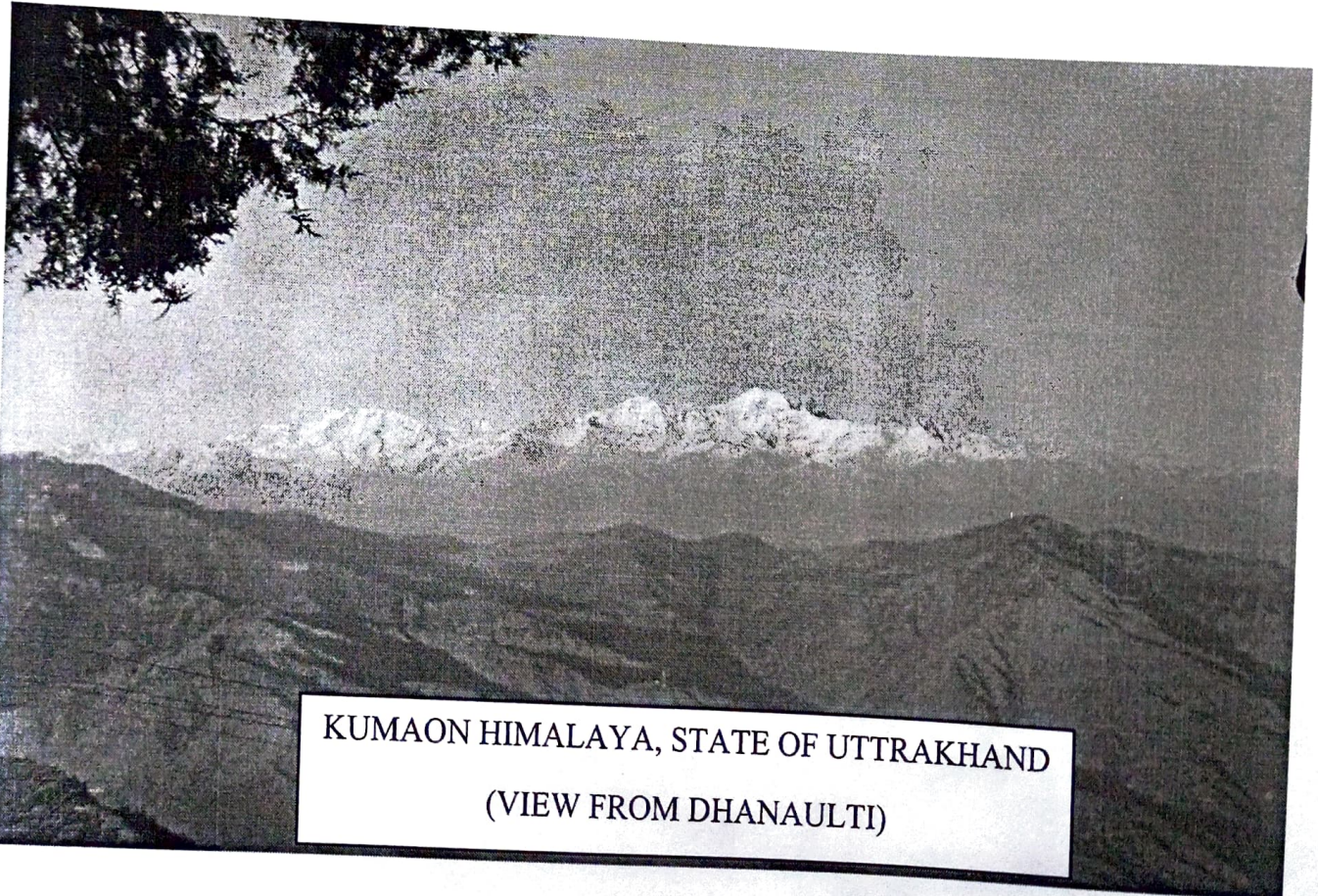
